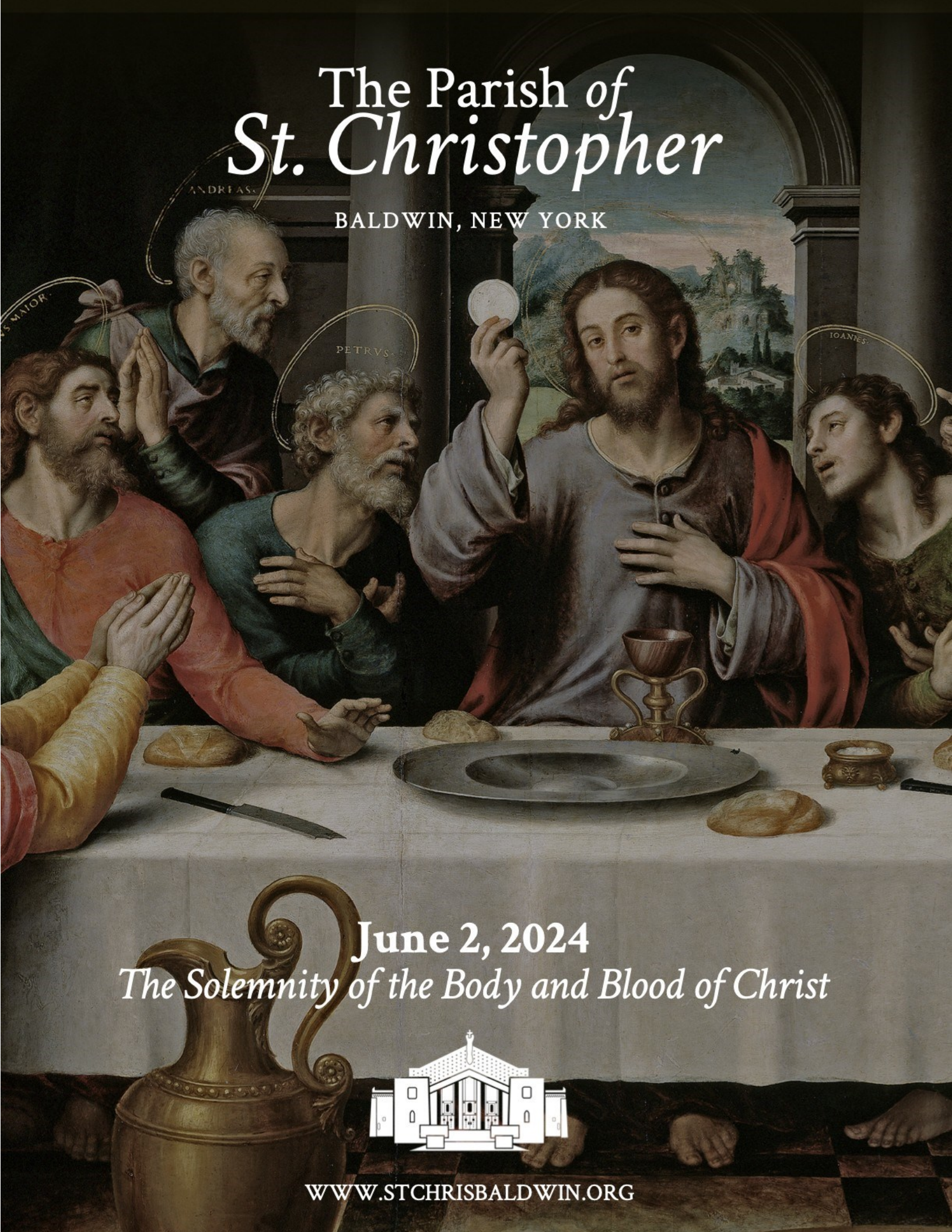

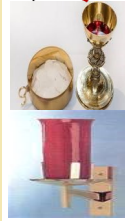
Prayer for Our Troops

Baptism/Bautismos

Pre-registration is required two months before Baptism for the preparation class and the actual date of Baptism. Pastor's Page

My dear Parishioners and Friends,

We celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ this weekend. It is also referred to as The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast honors Jesus Christ, really, truly, and substantially present under the appearances of bread and wine. This Presence happens through the change which the Church calls transubstantiation ("change of substance"), when at the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over bread and wine, **"This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me."**

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ: **the Holy Eucharist and the Church.** The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

Though Christ is present in many ways in his Church, his presence in the Eucharist is unique. He "makes himself wholly and entirely present" in the bread and wine. Therefore, the Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324)

"The Church and the world have a great need for eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease." - St. John Paul II,

The Feast of Corpus Christi is often used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others. Many parishes celebrate this feast with a tradition that goes all the way back to when it was instituted: the eucharistic procession. This opportunity of Eucharistic Processions invites us to share the Real Presence of Christ with the people around us.

Juliana and her twin sister, Agnes, were born in a village near Liège. They were orphaned at age five and placed in a newly founded hospice at Mont-Cornillon, outside of Liège. Liège was already a center for devotion to the Eucharist. So from her early youth, Juliana had great veneration for the Eucharist and longed for a special feast day in its honor. In 1208 at age 16, she began having visions of a full moon having one dark spot. Her vision presented the moon in its full splendor, crossed diametrically by a dark stripe. In time she came to understand that the moon symbolized the life of the Church on earth, and the opaque line represented the absence of a liturgical feast in honor of Christ's Body and Blood. Not having any way to bring about such a feast, she kept her thoughts to herself, except for sharing them with Blessed Eve of Liège and a few other trusted sisters in her monastery. The vision was repeated for the next 20 years, but she maintained it as a secret. When she eventually explained it to her confessor, he relayed it to the Bishop of Liège, Robert de Thorete. Eventually the celebration of Corpus Christi became part of the annual celebrations in the diocese.

In 1264 Pope Urban instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Pentecost as a feast for the entire Latin Rite, by the papal bull *Transiturus de hoc mundo*. Pope Urban also requested that St. Thomas Aquinas write an office (special prayers) and hymns for the feast. It is from these offices that we have the most well known Eucharistic songs: *Tantum Ergo*, *Pange Lingua*, and *O Salutaris Hostia*.

Pope Saint Paul VI, who spoke of the Eucharist as being, "...a mystery great and inexhaustible" invites us to remember and celebrate this Eucharistic mystery, to share in Jesus' miraculous love for us and for all sinners. Our Lord Jesus Christ, truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament, is worthy of our worship, our respect, and our love. In the Most Holy Eucharist, we truly receive Jesus – his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – nourishing us for those lonely moments that are so often part of our human experience, and reassuring us that God is always present in our lives. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to this great mystery! God bless you all.

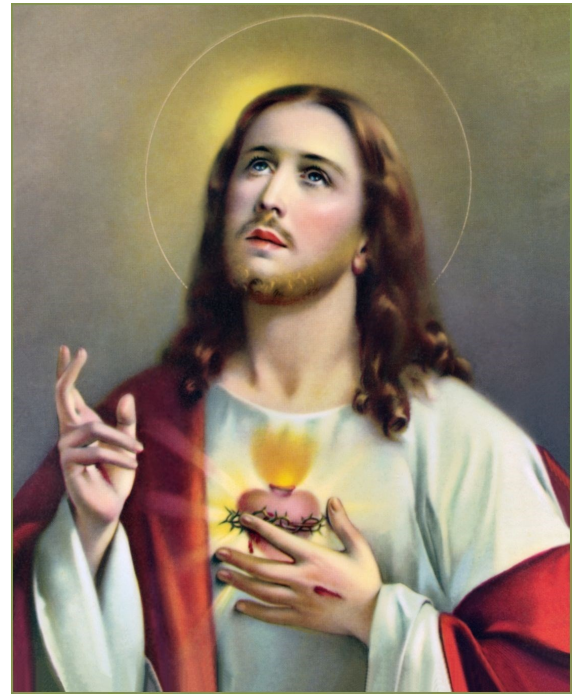

Liturgy

Devotion to The Sacred Heart of Jesus

The most significant story in shaping the Devotion to the Sacred Heart is found in the account of Jesus' death in the Gospel of John. After his death, a soldier pierced Jesus' heart with a spear, whereupon blood and water flowed out. The story showed that Jesus had given all he had in his love for us, leaving us with the waters of baptism and the blood of the Eucharist as signs of his continuing presence to us in the Church. The image of the pierced heart embodied for early Christians God's love shown in Jesus' life and death.



In the medieval Church, Christians were fascinated by the stories of Jesus' bodily life and focused on his body in their prayer. Devotions focused on Christ's wounds, allowing Christians to associate themselves emotionally with Jesus in his Passion. Out of these devotions grew devotion to Jesus' Sacred Heart and eventually, in 1670, to a Feast approved for some local Churches. The Devotion grew massively and took its recent form after Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Religious Sister, had visions of Jesus who instructed her to spread the devotion to his loving heart, and to have a Feast celebrated on the Friday after the Feast of Corpus Christi. She was supported by her Jesuit Spiritual Director, Claude de la Colombière. His writing and that of his colleagues contributed to the growth of devotion to the Sacred Heart.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart was providential at the time because it focused faith on God's tender love for us shown in Jesus' death. Other harsher expressions of faith, associated with the teaching of Cornelius Jansen, emphasized the soul at the expense of the body, God's stern judgment of sin, and the difficulty of salvation. Devotion to the Sacred Heart focused our attention on God's overwhelming love and forgiveness. It also allowed people living difficult and painful lives to associate their suffering with those of Jesus in his passion.

The Feast and the various devotions to the Sacred Heart, like many other devotions, are less popular today. But the heart of the Devotion with its focus on God's love for us shown in Jesus' death also remains the heart of Christian faith.

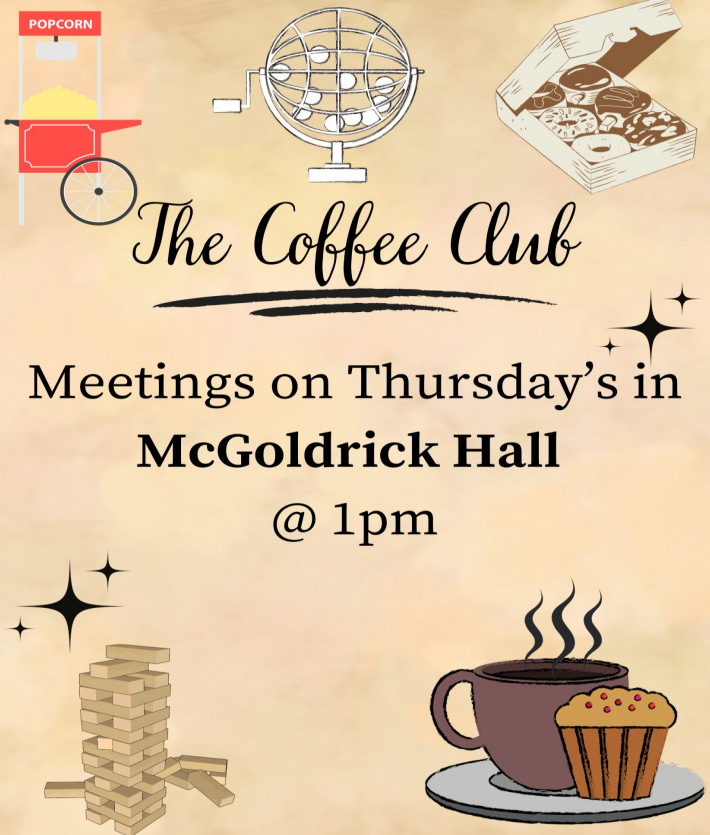
