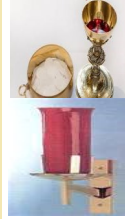

Baptism/Bautismos

Pre-registration is required two months before Baptism for the preparation class and the actual date of Baptism. Pastor's Page

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This coming week, each day we celebrate a different Saint and Thursday is the Queenship of Mary. Let us take time to reflect and think about the role models the Church puts before us, to help and guide us on our spiritual journey.

Monday, 19th: -Saint John Eudes: Born on a farm in northern France, joined the religious community of the Oratorians and ordained a priest at 24, he died at the age of 78. He was a great promoter of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. At age 32, St. John became a parish missionary. His gifts as a preacher and confessor won him great popularity. He preached over 100 parish missions, some lasting from several weeks to several months. In his concern with the spiritual improvement of the clergy, St. John realized that the greatest need was for seminaries. St. John founded a new community, called the Eudists—the Congregation of Jesus and Mary—devoted to the formation of the clergy by conducting diocesan seminaries. His Marian devotion was intense from a tender age, in 1652 he built the first church under the Immaculate Heart's patronage: the chapel of his seminary in Coutances, France.

Tuesday, 20th: - St. Bernard : Abbot & Doctor of the Church: Bernard was born into a high-nobility family in Fontaines, France. He was the third of seven children, with five brothers and one sister. He excelled in the study of Scripture, personalizing it through prayer. He had a profound devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, continually seeking her intercession. His mother's death sparked a deeper resolve to abandon worldly pursuits and live solely for God.

“Admit that God deserves to be loved very much, yea, boundlessly, because He loved us first, He infinite and we nothing, loved us, miserable sinners, with a love so great and so free. This is why I said at the beginning that the measure of our love to God is to love immeasurably. For since our love is toward God, who is infinite and immeasurable, how can we bound or limit the love we owe Him? Besides, our love is not a gift but a debt. And since it is the Godhead who loves us, Himself boundless, eternal, supreme love, of whose greatness there is no end, yea, and His wisdom is infinite, whose peace passeth all understanding; since it is He who loves us, I say, can we think of repaying Him grudgingly?” ~ Saint Bernard, On Loving God

Wednesday, 21st - St. Pius X: Pope Pius X is perhaps best remembered for promoting frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children.

“His humble background was no obstacle in relating to a personal God and to people whom he loved genuinely. Pius X gained his strength, his gentleness and warmth for people from the source of all gifts, the Spirit of Jesus. In contrast, we often feel embarrassed by our backgrounds. Shame makes us prefer to remain aloof from people whom we perceive as superior. If we are in a superior position, on the other hand, we often ignore simpler people. Yet we, too, have to help ‘restore all things in Christ,’ especially the wounded people of God.”

Thursday, 22nd - Queenship of Mary: The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is celebrated on the octave day of this Solemnity. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power. He said; **“let all approach with greater confidence now than before, to the throne of mercy and grace of our Queen and Mother to beg help in difficulty, light in darkness and solace in trouble and sorrow...”**

Friday, 23rd - St. Rose of Lima: She was known for her piety and chastity. Born in 1586 in Lima, Peru. Her beauty was so great that she was nicknamed "Rose," a name that remains with her to this day. From an early age, Rose wanted to become a nun. She often prayed and fasted in secret. She performed secret penances, some of which were painful and severe. She performed daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and took daily communion. When she turned 20, she was permitted to join the Third Order of St. Dominic. She continued a life of extreme prayer, fasting and penance.

Saturday, 24th - St. Bartholomew, Apostle: One of the twelve apostles, he is mentioned in the synoptic gospels and Acts as one of the twelve. His name means "son of Talmi" and scholars believe he is the same as Nathanael mentioned in John, who says he is from Cana and that Jesus called him an "Israelite...incapable of deceit." Nothing is known for sure about the life of Bartholomew after the Ascension of Jesus, but tradition holds that he preached in the East, Indian Subcontinent and died a martyr's death in Armenia, being flayed alive for having won converts to the Lord Jesus.

Liturgy

Pope Saint Pius X

In the conclave of 1903, the Emperor of Austria vetoed Cardinal Mariano Rampolla del Tindaro, the Secretary of State under Pope Leo XIII, who was the first to be elected. This veto was delivered through the Prince-Bishop of Krakow. A few ballots later, Cardinal Sarto received almost unanimous consent and was elected pope at the age of sixty-eight years, choosing the name Pius X. He later changed the rules for papal elections, eliminating outside influence such as the veto.

As pope, Pius X took as his motto, “To restore all things in Christ” (Ephesians 1:10). Remaining as he was when he was a parish priest, spiritual director, and bishop, he was humble, simple, loved teaching children, and showed concern for the poor. He introduced a universal catechism, reformed the curia, renewed seminary formation, revised the Code of Canon Law, revitalized the liturgy, encouraged Gregorian Chant, and emphasized the teachings of Saint Thomas Aquinas. At heart, he was a pastor, not a diplomat or politician. Without ambition, he never sought the elevations he received, but accepted all things in Christ with humility and surrender.



Most notably, his love for children and his long history of catechizing them led him to lower the age for First Holy Communion from twelve to seven, encouraging frequent reception of the Eucharist for them and all people. Deeply devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he often spoke of her and honored her. Although he never received a doctorate degree, he was highly intelligent and firmly opposed modernism within the Catholic Church, viewing it as a synthesis of all heresies where doctrines were presented in a scattered and disjointed manner, thus creating doubts. In response, he preached that the Catholic faith was very reasonable, systematic, and clear—hence, his love for Saint Thomas Aquinas and Canon Law.
