Baptism/Bautismos

Pre-registration is required two months before Baptism for the preparation class and the actual date of Baptism. My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In less than two weeks, we will begin our 40-day journey to the foot of the Cross, culminating in the celebration of Christ's salvific work through His suffering, death, and resurrection. But how can we truly prepare to observe Lent? Why is this season so vital for our spiritual lives?

Lent is an extended act of prayer and penance, inviting us into a deeper relationship with Christ. It is a journey of spiritual discipline, leading us to conversion and renewal. This season is not merely a time of giving things up but an opportunity to realign our hearts with God.

So, before Ash Wednesday, let us make it a point to sit down and give some thought to how you want to spend this Lent. If you have no idea where to begin, the Church supports us on our spiritual journey. There are three holy practices which Catholics are called to embrace during this penitential season. These three practices are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving; choose something specific from each category.

In the days prior to Lent, try one or more of the following three thoughts suggested by Ignatius spirituality:

- Ask God, every day, **"What does my soul need?"** Just ask, and wait quietly. Because we're very good at fooling ourselves about how we're doing, it might take several days of praying this question before we're truly open and humble enough to know the answer.

- Ask God, every day, **"What about my life makes you happy?"** Yes, when God looks at your life, some parts of it—perhaps many aspects of it—bring joy to God's heart. Think of how your children or grandchildren or other people close to you make you happy. God is in relationship with you, which means that your sins grieve God's heart, but also that your growth and love and freedom and kindness bring joy to God of the universe. Again, you will probably need to pray this a few times before you are willing to consider that you give God pleasure, that you make God happy in any way. Stick with this little prayer and keep listening.

- Tell God, and yourself, every day, **"I want to be open to the graces of this Lenten season."** Maybe you're not open right now, or you're not as open and willing as you'd like to be or think you should be. What else is new? We can always open our lives a bit more, let go of more stuff, listen better, and do more quickly and passionately what we know helps nurture God's kingdom on earth.

Let us always remember, during Lent, we are invited to surrender attachments that distract us from God, whether they be material comforts, unhealthy habits, or even attitudes that keep us from living out fully the faith. What do we turn to for comfort instead of Christ? What consumes our time and energy more than prayer? As we lay down these "idols," we make room for God's grace to work in us.

Having said that, a final word: It is tempting to view Lent as a time for ambitious personal resolutions, but its purpose is much deeper. Rather than overburdening ourselves with excessive resolutions, we should focus on a few meaningful sacrifices and spiritual disciplines. Lent is a lifelong journey—one that the Church guides us through year after year. Even when we fail, Lent reminds us of our weakness and our need for God's grace.

"If we have died with Him, we shall also live with Him" - 2 Timothy 2:11.

Liturgy

St. Gregory of Narek

Gregory was raised in a monastery and eventually entered the Narek Monastery, known as Narekavank in what is now Turkey, as a monk and lived there for nearly the entirety of his life.

At the time, Armenia was experiencing a literature, painting, architecture, and theological renaissance, in which Gregory participated.

As an Armenian monk, Gregory lived humbly and taught at the monastic school. He wrote his prayers in the *encyclopedia of prayer for all nations* in hopes the book would one day guide people of all stations around the world to prayer.

He was a leader of the well-developed school of Armenian mysticism at the Monastery and was asked to answer the question, "What can one offer to God, our creator, who already has everything and knows everything better than we could ever express it?"

In his *Book of Prayer*, also called the *Book of Lamentations* or the *Song of Songs*, Gregory wrote that the answer to the question is "the sighs of the heart." The book contains 91 prayers and was completed one year before he died.

Several miracles and traditions have been traced back to Gregory and he is known as "the watchful angel in human form."

Gregory of Narek was venerated as a saint by the Armenian Catholic Church and is also recognized as a saint of the Roman Catholic church. On April 12, 2015, Pope Francis officially proclaimed Gregory of Narek as a Doctor of the Church.

Saint Gregory has been depicted holding his book of prayer in a variety of artwork and a professor of psychiatry was able to develop a unique kind of therapy based on Saint Gregory's *Book of Lamentations*.

Though he has yet to be proclaimed the patron saint of a particular patronage, his *Book of Prayer* has been used to treat several diseases including schizophrenia, Hepatitis C, periodic disease, stress symptoms and depression.

Holy Year 2025 "Checklist"

Participating in a Jubilee Year includes several spiritual practices:

1. **Visiting designated holy sites**, such as the four major basilicas in Rome or local churches in your dioceses, symbolizes a journey of faith and conversion.
2. **Sacrament of Reconciliation:** Confession is encouraged to receive God's forgiveness and grace, as emphasized in John 20:21-23; and—along with receiving the Eucharist—this sacrament is necessary to **obtain** an indulgence
3. **By fulfilling certain conditions**, including prayers, a pilgrimage, or acts of charity, Catholics can receive indulgences, which reduce or eliminate temporal punishment for sins.
4. **Acts of Mercy:** Engaging in corporal and spiritual works of mercy, like feeding the hungry or comforting the sorrowful, reflects Christ's love.
5. **Prayer and Reflection:** Deepening one's prayer life and reflecting on Scripture strengthens one's relationship with God.

Pilgrimages to designated holy sites, doing acts of charity, and receiving the sacrament of reconciliation are emphasized.

The Jubilee is a reminder of God's mercy and the call to live out the gospel more fully. These practices help Catholics grow in holiness and experience God's mercy.

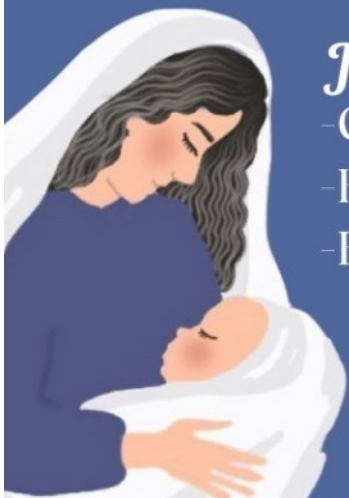
